United States Army Golden Knights – The Golden Knights are the U.S. Army's official aerial parachute demonstration team comprising elite volunteers from all branches of the Army. Each air show will begin with a colorful and patriotic presentation of the American flag as the team jumps from their Fokker C-31A Troopship to a landing on the newly renovated Gateway Arch grounds.



Aeroshell Aerobatic Team – The North American AT-6 was first introduced in 1938 and became the



primary training aircraft for WWII fighter pilots who went on to fly famous aircraft like the F4U Corsair, P-51 Mustang and P-40 Warhawk for the U.S. Army Air Corps. The award-winning Aeroshell team is internationally renowned for flying 4-aircraft precision formations where distance between wingtips may be as tight as 3 feet! The maneuverability of the planes and the roar of their 600 horsepower engines make Aeroshell an air show favorite!



Bob Carlton in the Super Salto Sailplane – Bob Carlton returns to St. Louis in a spectacular sailplane that he alone designed and built. This modified glider does not require another aircraft to tow it to altitude because it is self-propelled by a PBS TJ-100 jet engine! Crowds will be amazed by the aerobatic maneuvers that Bob can achieve in this one-of-a-kind aircraft.

Matt Younkin in the Twin Beech 18 – Matt represents the third generation of a legendary air show family, and his musically choreographed performances in the classic twin-engine Beech 18, have been described as “the most graceful and beautiful performance the air show industry has to offer.”



Gregory “Wired” Colyer in the T-33 “Ace Maker” – The Lockheed T-33 Shooting Star came into service with the U.S. Navy in 1948 and was America’s first operational jet fighter and trainer. Audiences will marvel at the superb design and flying speed of this Korean War era jet fighter.

Rob Holland in the carbon-fiber MXS-RH – Rob Holland is among the elite airshow performers and freestyle aerobatic competition pilots in the world today with 24 international competition medals and numerous aerobatic flying awards to his name. The MXS-RH is a one-of-a-kind, American made aerobatic monster that is capable of pulling 16 positive and negative Gs, and rolls at nearly 500 degrees per second!



Paradigm Aerobatic Team – This team of 6 pilots from the U.S., Spain and France fly ultralights powered by lightweight two stroke engines worn like a backpack. Together the team performs synchronized maneuvers reminiscent of an aerial three ring circus that truly must be seen to be believed.
